Mr. S. Graham gave Notice of Motion 86 that on Tuesday, May 1, 2001, he would move the following resolution, seconded by Mr. Allaby:
That an address be presented to Her Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that she cause to be laid upon the table of the House copies of all sole source contracts that the government has issued without tender for the past 2 years.
Mr. S. Graham gave Notice of Motion 87 that on Tuesday, May 1, 2001, he would move the following resolution, seconded by Mr. Allaby:
That an address be presented to Her Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that she cause to be laid upon the table of the House copies of all contracts for professional services that the government has issued for the past 2 years.
