Your Committee on Private Bills met on May 16, 2002, in the Legislative Council Chamber and had under consideration:

Bill 49, An Act to Amend the Registered Nursing Assistants Act,

which it recommends to the favourable consideration of the House.

Your Committee also met on May 21, 2002, in the Legislative Council Chamber and had under consideration:

Bill 50, Opticians Act,

which it recommends to the favourable consideration of the House with certain amendments.

And your Committee begs leave to make a further report.

I move, seconded by Mr. Huntjens, that the report be concurred in by the House.

Mr. Speaker put the question on the motion of concurrence and it was resolved in the affirmative.

Mr. Richard rose and indicated that it was his understanding that the House would consider the estimates of the Maritime Provinces Higher Education Commission.

At the request of the Deputy House Leader, at 2.45 o'clock p.m., Mr. Speaker declared a brief recess and left the chair.

Mr. Speaker resumed the chair and declared that, at the request of Hon. Mr. P. Robichaud, the House would recess for an additional 15 minutes.
