Hon. Mr. Burke gave Notice of Motion 24 that on Tuesday, December 16, 2008, he would move the following resolution, seconded by Mr. Harrison:

WHEREAS between 1869 and 1948 approximately 100,000 British Home Children were brought to Canada to work on farms and as domestic helpers;

WHEREAS many of these children came to New Brunswick;

WHEREAS these children lived through separation from their families and country and many experienced difficult conditions and hardship in their new homes;

WHEREAS it is estimated that 12 percent of the Canadian population is descended from the British Home Children;

WHEREAS the story of the British Home children is a significant piece of our history and heritage;

WHEREAS in 2009 the surviving British Home Children and descendants will be commemorating the 140th anniversary of the first arrival of these children in Canada;

BE IT RESOLVED that this Legislature recognize 2009 as the Year of the British Home Child.

Pursuant to Standing Rule 44(4), Mr. Robichaud, Opposition House Leader, gave notice that on Thursday, December 11, 2008, it was the intention of the Opposition to consider Opposition Members' Business in the following order: resumption of debate on second reading of Bill 17; second reading of Bill 18; and Motion 21.
