Prayers.

Ms. Blaney, Member for Rothesay, laid upon the table of the House a petition on behalf of residents of the Rothesay area urging the government to make the required capital investments in Kennebecasis Park Elementary School. (Petition 38)

Mr. Holder, Member for Saint John Portland, laid upon the table of the House a petition on behalf of concerned citizens opposed to the removal of regional government services and jobs in rural New Brunswick, including jobs from the Hampton Government Garage and the ferries in the lower St. John River. (Petition 39)

Mr. Harrison, Member for Hampton-Kings, laid upon the table of the House a petition on behalf of residents of the St. John River Valley in opposition to the removal of the ferry service across the St. John River at Gagetown, Hampstead and Belleisle. (Petition 40)

Mr. C. Landry gave Notice of Motion 56, that on Thursday, April 30, 2009, he would move the following resolution, seconded by Ms. Dubé:

That an address be presented to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that he cause to be laid upon the table of the House all records and documents in the government's possession, however recorded or stored, related to any domestic or international travel by the Minister of Education, his staff, or members of his department and the reason for each trip, since October 3, 2006.

Hon. Mr. Murphy, Government House Leader, announced that it was the intention of government that the House resolve itself into a Committee of Supply to consider the estimates of the Department of Justice and Consumer Affairs, the Office of the Attorney General, and the Department of Public Safety.

The House, according to order, resolved itself into a Committee of Supply with Mr. Fraser in the chair.

At 5.03 o'clock p.m., the Chairman declared a recess and left the chair.

5.12 o'clock p.m.

The Committee resumed with Mr. Fraser in the chair.

And after some time, Mr. Speaker resumed the chair, and Mr. Fraser, the Chairman, after requesting that Mr. Speaker revert to Presentations of Committee Reports, reported that the Committee had had under consideration the matters referred to them, had made some progress therein, had passed several items, and asked leave to sit again.

Pursuant to Standing Rule 78.1, Mr. Speaker then put the question on the motion deemed to be before the House, that the report be concurred in, and it was resolved in the affirmative.
