

10 o'clock a.m.

Prayers.

Due to the unavoidable absence of Mr. Speaker, Mr. Fraser, the Deputy Speaker, took the chair as Acting Speaker.

Mr. Paulin, Member for Restigouche-la-Vallée, laid upon the table of the House a petition on behalf of residents of the Campbellton region urging the government to install moose fencing on the Duff Lake Road between Campbellton and Glencoe. (Petition 71)

Mr. Williams, Member for Kent South, laid upon the table of the House a petition on behalf of residents the Cap-Pelé area urging the government to reverse its decision to cut the Cap-pelé government garage to a winter only operation. (Petition 72)

Hon. Mr. Murphy, Government House Leader, announced that it was the intention of government that Bills 46, 88, 70, 71, 72, and 73 be called for second reading; following which, with leave of the House, Bills 46, 88, 70, 71, 72, and 73 would be considered in Committee of the Whole.

It was agreed by unanimous consent to recess at 12.30 o'clock p.m., and to resume at 2 o'clock p.m.

The following Bills were read a third time:

Bill 62, An Act to Amend the Agricultural Development Act.

- Bill 68, An Act to Amend the Order of New Brunswick Act.
- Bill 69, Automated Defibrillator Act.
- Bill 77, An Act Respecting the Agricultural Development Board, the New Brunswick Fisheries and Aquaculture Development Board and the Transfer of Responsibility for Financial Assistance Programs.

Ordered that the said Bills do pass.

The Order being read for second reading of Bill 46, *An Act to Amend the New Brunswick Income Tax Act*, a debate arose thereon.

And the debate being ended, and the question being put that Bill 46 be now read a second time, it was resolved in the affirmative. Accordingly, Bill 46, *An Act to Amend the New Brunswick Income Tax Act*, was read a second time and ordered referred to the Committee of the Whole House.

The Order being read for second reading of Bill 88, *Personal Health Information Privacy and Access Act*, a debate arose thereon.

And the debate being ended, and the question being put that Bill 88 be now read a second time, it was resolved in the affirmative.

Accordingly, Bill 88, *Personal Health Information Privacy and Access Act*, was read a second time and ordered referred to the Committee of the Whole House.

The Order being read for second reading of Bill 70, *An Act to Amend the Motor Vehicle Act*, a debate arose thereon.

And the debate being ended, and the question being put that Bill 70 be now read a second time, it was resolved in the affirmative.

Accordingly, Bill 70, *An Act to Amend the Motor Vehicle Act*, was read a second time and ordered referred to the Committee of the Whole House.

The Order being read for second reading of Bill 71, *An Act to Amend the Highway Act*, a debate arose thereon.

And the debate being ended, and the question being put that Bill 71 be now read a second time, it was resolved in the affirmative.

Accordingly, Bill 71, *An Act to Amend the Highway Act*, was read a second time and ordered referred to the Committee of the Whole House.

The Order being read for second reading of Bill 72, *An Act to Amend the Education Act*, a debate arose thereon.

And the debate being ended, and the question being put that Bill 72 be now read a second time, it was resolved in the affirmative.

Accordingly, Bill 72, *An Act to Amend the Education Act*, was read a second time and ordered referred to the Committee of the Whole House.

The Order being read for second reading of Bill 73, *An Act to Amend the Electricity Act*, a debate arose thereon.

The House resumed with Mr. Fraser, the Deputy Speaker in the chair.

And the debate being ended, and the question being put that Bill 73 be now read a second time, it was resolved in the affirmative.

Accordingly, Bill 73, An Act to Amend the Electricity Act, was read a second time and ordered referred to the Committee of the Whole House.

It was agreed by unanimous consent that Bills 46, 88, 70, 71, 72, and 73 be considered in the Committee of the Whole forthwith.

The House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole with Ms. Robichaud in the chair.

And after some time, Ms. Lavoie took the chair.

And after some further time, Ms. Robichaud resumed the chair.

And after some further time spent in Committee of the Whole, Mr. Fraser, the Deputy Speaker resumed the chair and Ms. Robichaud, the Chair, after requesting that the Deputy Speaker revert to Presentations of Committee Reports, reported:

That the Committee had directed that she report the following Bills as agreed to:

Bill 46, An Act to Amend the New Brunswick Income Tax Act.

Bill 70, An Act to Amend the Motor Vehicle Act.

Bill 71, An Act to Amend the Highway Act.

Bill 72, An Act to Amend the Education Act.

Bill 73, An Act to Amend the Electricity Act.

Bill 88, Personal Health Information Privacy and Access Act.

And the Committee asked leave to make a further report.
