Mr. Paulin, Member for Restigouche-la-Vallée, laid upon the table of the House a petition on behalf of residents of northern New Brunswick who oppose spraying, for whatever reason, as irresponsible and dangerous for the health of every form of life. (Petition 6)

Mr. Urquhart, Member for York, laid upon the table of the House a petition on behalf of residents of the Burtts Corner, Zealand, Keswick, Stanley and surrounding areas who oppose the sale of NBPower to Hydro-Québec. (Petition 7)

Mr. D. Graham, Member for Carleton, laid upon the table of the House a petition on behalf of residents of the Balmoral, Charlo, Dalhousie, Eel River Crossing, Saint Maure and surrounding areas who oppose the sale of NBPower to Hydro-Québec. (Petition 8)

Mr. Harrison, Member for Hampton-Kings, laid upon the table of the House a petition on behalf of residents of the Dalhousie, Eel River Crossing, Point la Nim, Balmoral and surrounding areas who oppose the sale of NBPower to Hydro-Québec. (Petition 9)

That an address be presented to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that he cause to be laid upon the table of the House all correspondence however recorded or stored between the Office of the Premier, Premier Shawn Graham, the Minister of Energy, Mr. Doug Tyler and any member of the Board of Directors of NB Power since January 1, 2009, related to any business dealings with the Province of Québec and Hydro-Québec.

Hon. Mr. Murphy, Government House Leader, announced that it was the intention of government that the House resume the adjourned debate on the motion for an Address in Reply to the Speech from the Throne.
