Mr. Betts, Member for Moncton Crescent, laid upon the table of the House a petition on behalf of residents of Fredericton, New Maryland, Jewetts Mills, Cambridge Narrows, Douglas, Rusagonis and surrounding areas who oppose the sale of NB Power to Hydro-Québec. (Petition 151)

Ms. Blaney, Member for Rothesay, laid upon the table of the House a petition on behalf of residents of Miramichi, Blackville and surrounding areas who oppose the sale of NB Power to Hydro-Québec. (Petition 152)

Mr. D. Graham, Member for Carleton, laid upon the table of the House a petition on behalf of residents of Renous, Miramichi, Barnaby, Quarryville, Whitney, and Derby Junction area who oppose the sale of NB Power to Hydro-Québec. (Petition 153)

Mr. C. Landry, Member for Tracadie-Sheila, laid upon the table of the House a petition on behalf of residents of Saint-Sauveur, Saint-Pons, Saumarez, Tracadie-Sheila and surrounding areas who oppose the sale of NB Power to Hydro-Québec. (Petition 154)

Hon. Mr. Byrne, Government House Leader, announced that it was the intention of government that the House resolve itself into a Committee of Supply to consider the estimates of the Department of Health.

The following Bill was read a third time:

Bill 7, *Heritage Conservation Act*.

Ordered that the said Bill does pass.

The House, according to Order, resolved itself into a Committee of Supply with Mr. Fraser in the chair.

And after some time, Mr. Speaker resumed the chair, and Mr. Fraser, the Chair, after requesting that Mr. Speaker revert to Presentations of Committee Reports, reported that the Committee had had under consideration the matters referred to them, had made some progress therein, and asked leave to sit again.

Pursuant to Standing Rule 78.1, Mr. Speaker then put the question on the motion deemed to be before the House, that the report be concurred in, and it was resolved in the affirmative.

And then, 6 o'clock p.m., the House adjourned.
