Ms. Dubé, Member for Edmundston—Saint-Basile, laid upon the table of the House a petition on behalf of residents of Miramichi, South Nelson, Lower Newcastle, Napan and surrounding areas who oppose the sale of NB Power to Hydro-Québec. (Petition 156)

Mr. Northrup, Member for Kings East, laid upon the table of the House a petition on behalf of residents of Meductic, Miramichi, Napan, Moncton, Saint John, Campbellton, Bay du Vin, Chatham and surrounding areas who oppose the sale of NB Power to Hydro-Québec. (Petition 157)

Pursuant to Standing Rule 44(4), Mr. Robichaud, Opposition House Leader, gave notice that on Thursday, January 28, 2010, Opposition Members' business would be considered in the following order: second reading of Bill 28; Motion 35; and resumption of the debate on Motion 29.
