Mr. C. LeBlanc, Member for Dieppe Centre-Lewisville, laid upon the table of the House a petition on behalf of residents of Memramcook, Dieppe and surrounding areas who oppose the sale of NB Power to Hydro-Québec. (Petition 167)

Mr. Olscamp, Member for Tantramar, laid upon the table of the House a petition on behalf of residents of Sackville, Jolicure, Woodpoint, Dorchester, Moncton and surrounding areas opposing the sale of NB Power to Hydro-Québec and urging the government to stop all negotiations with Hydro-Québec. (Petition 168)

Mr. D. Graham, Member for Carleton, laid upon the table of the House a petition on behalf of residents of Exmoor, Sunny Corner, Sevogle, Renous, Glenwood, Miramichi, Sillikers, Saint John, Charlo and surrounding areas who oppose the sale of NB Power to Hydro-Québec. (Petition 169)

Mr. C. Landry, Member for Tracadie-Sheila, laid upon the table of the House a petition on behalf of residents of Maple Glen, Miramichi, Red Bank, Sunny Corner, Derby Junction, Tracadie-Sheila and surrounding areas who oppose the sale of NB Power to Hydro-Québec. (Petition 170)

Ms. Dubé, Member for Edmundston—Saint-Basile, laid upon the table of the House a petition on behalf of residents of Red Bank, Blackville, Miramichi, Bushville, Cassilis, Chelmsford, Lower Newcastle, South Esk, Russellville, Black River Siding, Napan, Halcomb and surrounding areas who oppose the sale of NB Power to Hydro-Québec. (Petition 171)

Hon. Mr. Keir laid upon the table of the House a document entitled "Advisory Panel on the Proposed New Brunswick-Québec Electricity Transaction, February 1, 2010, Chair, David A. Ganong."

Hon. Mr. Byrne, Government House Leader, announced that it was the intention of government that the House resolve itself into a Committee of Supply to consider the estimates of the Department of Natural Resources and the Department of Public Safety.
