Mr. D. Graham, Member for Carleton, laid upon the table of the House a petition on behalf of residents of Miramichi, Whitney, Newcastle, Sillikers, Chatham and surrounding areas who oppose the sale of NB Power to Hydro-Québec. (Petition 234)

Mr. Betts, Member for Moncton Crescent, laid upon the table of the House a petition on behalf of residents of Saint John, Rothesay, St. Stephen and surrounding areas who oppose the sale of NB Power to Hydro-Québec. (Petition 235)

Pursuant to Standing Rule 44(4), Mr. Robichaud, Opposition House Leader, gave notice that on Thursday, March 18, 2010, Opposition Members' Business would be considered in the following order: Motion 49; Motion 7, and Motion 53.

Hon. Mr. Byrne, Government House Leader, announced that it was the intention of government that the House resolve itself into a Committee of Supply to consider the estimates of the Regional Development Corporation; following which the House would resolve itself into a Committee of the Whole to consider Bill 16.

At 3 o'clock p.m., with leave of the House, the *Appropriations Act* 2010-2011 would be introduced for first reading; following which, Bills 30, 31, 28, 32, 33 and 34 would be called for second reading.

The House, according to Order, resolved itself into a Committee of Supply with Mr. Fraser in the chair.

And after some time, Mr. Speaker resumed the chair, and Mr. Fraser, the Chair, after requesting that Mr. Speaker revert to Presentations of Committee Reports, reported that the Committee had had under consideration the matters referred to them and had passed all remaining items.
